

# Upper School Dress Code 2007-2008

## Gentlemen

### **Shirts/Sweaters**

- Collared shirts or turtlenecks, appropriately buttoned and tucked-in (no t-shirts)
- Sweaters may be worn and do not have to be tucked in

### **Pants/Shorts**

- Denim, casual and dress slacks or shorts with belts, worn at the waist (no cargo)
- Pants/Shorts must be in good repair; no holes, writings or paintings

### **Shoes**

- Dress shoes, tennis shoes, or any type of sandal that is clean and in good repair (no flip flops)

### **Outerwear**

- Jackets with zipper or any sweatshirt or hoddie bearing the ASES logo are allowed.
- Students must be in dress code under outerwear.

### **Hair – Acceptable**

- Neat, clean, above the collar and eyebrows, and not below the ear
- Men must be clean shaven at the beginning of the school day

## Ladies

### **Shirts/Blouses/Sweaters**

- Blouses, shirts, sweaters and turtlenecks (no t-shirts)
- Modest sleeveless shirts that fully cover the shoulder and fit closely around the arm

### **Skirts/Pants/Shorts**

- Denim, casual and dress pants or shorts(no holes, writings or paintings on pants or shorts)
- Skirts and dresses
- Skirts, shorts and dresses will be worn no more than four inches above the knee

### **Shoes**

- Dress shoes, tennis shoes, or any type of sandal that is clean and in good repair (no flip flops)

### **Outerwear**

- Jackets with zipper or any sweatshirt or hoddie bearing the ASES logo are allowed.
- Students must be in dress code under outerwear.

## Assembly/Chapel Dress

### **Gentlemen:**

- Dress slacks, belt, oxford shirt and a tie
- Socks – White, khaki, navy or blue
- Shoes – Leather dress shoes or boots

### **Ladies:**

- Skirts, dress pants, or dresses
- Blouses, shirts, sweaters and turtlenecks (no t-shirts)
- Socks – Not required, but if worn, must be white, khaki, navy or black knee socks or bobby socks. White, navy, black, or natural hosiery may be worn.
- Shoes –Leather dress shoes or boots

### Fridays

- Students may wear their Adopt-a-Trojan shirts, tucked in

### Spirit Days:

- Spirit days may be arranged by groups and organizations for special events and activities in the life of the school. Spirit dress days must be approved by the administration, and will be announced in advance of the planned date.

### General Guidelines

- Clothing bearing logos, emblems, slogans, artwork, pictures or advertisements that are negative, morally improper, or otherwise not in keeping with the school's Christian environment is not allowed.
- Tight fitting clothing is not allowed.
- Jewelry and makeup that are distracting are not allowed. Body piercing is not allowed. Men will not wear earrings.
- Students must be in dress code under outerwear.

**This dress code is not intended to cover all possible situations; common sense and propriety are the best guidelines. Teachers and administration determine if a student's dress is not appropriate.**
